

There are over 2200 townlands in Fermanagh.



WHO WE ARE

Fermanagh Genealogy Centre is run by Volunteers. It was established in 2012 and has operated as a delivery partner for Fermanagh and Omagh District Council since October 2013

WHAT WE ARE

We are a charitable organisation, who assist visitors to find their family history connections in Fermanagh. Our aim is to create a welcoming place for visitors and volunteers, irrespective of religious, ethnic or cultural background.

AIMS and OBJECTIVES

To promote the history and heritage of Fermanagh and the public and private study of family history by engaging in educational and research activities and assisting people who wish to research their own family history.

OUR SUPPORTERS

We have been supported by Fermanagh Trust, Fermanagh and Omagh District Council, Volunteer Now and the Association of Independent Volunteer Centres.

WHAT WE DO

As a genealogy delivery partner for Fermanagh and Omagh District Council, the Centre provides a free thirty-minute face-to-face consultation meeting. This signposting service is provided by volunteers and provides visitors with assistance in their own family history research, outlining the records available and possible avenues of research. It is recommended that visitors make a booking. We do not currently hold any records, although we are undertaking a number of transcription projects. Fermanagh Genealogy also provides an email enquiry service on the Enniskillen Castle website. As this service is provided by volunteers, it can take a month for us to answer email enquiries.

AN OPPORTUNITY TO BE A VOLUNTEER

Volunteering for the Genealogy Centre is an opportunity to make new friends and to help others in their search for their family history connections to Fermanagh. It is also an opportunity to learn more about how to search for your own family history. We provide regular training for our volunteers, so that they are familiar with the range of material available. Opportunities exist for people to volunteer in the Centre on a fortnightly basis. We are very flexible and can also offer monthly opportunities.

WHERE WE ARE

For genealogy appointments, we are based at the new **Enniskillen Castle Visitor Centre**. Our regular family history talks take place at **Enniskillen Library**. Our volunteer training sessions and board meetings take place at **Fermanagh House**.

WHEN WE OPERATE

We are open for family history consultations on Monday, Wednesday and Thursday afternoons from 2pm to 4.30pm. Appointments can be booked between 2.15pm and 3.45pm. The Genealogy Centre is closed on all bank holidays. We also close in December and January. Our family history talks usually take place on the third Saturday of the month between September and May.
